


Income Breakdown

Investing in Our Future & Readiness for 2026

CWC continued careful financial management and investment to ensure the stability, flexibility, and long-term strength of the organization. The new operational endowment continues to grow. With generous support from Ducks Unlimited, the stewardship endowment almost doubled in 2025.

Nature for All

In 2025, CWC launched Nature for All, an organization-wide commitment to expanding accessibility and inclusion across our land preserves. The Nature for All Committee is made up of a diverse group of **28 representatives** that includes individuals of differing abilities and backgrounds and leaders from **8 advocacy and support organizations** across the county.

Building on decades of exemplary land stewardship, environmental advocacy, and community engagement, this initiative seeks to remove barriers to outdoor access, raise awareness, and foster meaningful connections between nature and people of all backgrounds and abilities.

The committee has identified the Loomis Goose Creek Preserve as the starting location for improvement efforts that reflect the lived experiences, needs, and priorities of people with different abilities. The scope of improvements includes paved parking, an ADA-compliant trail system, updated wayfinding, accessible overlook areas, audio interpretations, and other components of universal design.



Acquisitions


2025 was a year of growth and momentum for CWC, marking one of the most productive land conservation years in the organization's history. Land Acquisition Coordinator Daniel Conklin helped secure **3 new conservation properties totaling more than 85 acres**. Each of these locations strengthens habitats, protects water quality, and creates new opportunities for restoration and education.

- **Siggins Property**
5.5-acre wetland that helps protect the functionality of the Goose Creek floodplain
- **Moon Road Property**
Wetland site acquired in partnership with Ducks Unlimited through their in-lieu fee program
- **Retained Life Estate**
Expands protection of the Prendergast Creek Wetland Preserve



Restoration Projects

A large part of CWC's mission is to restore crucial habitats throughout the watersheds of the Chautauqua region. This work is vital not only for the land and wildlife, but also for people and infrastructure. With the help of community collaborators and partnerships, staff, and volunteers, Director of Conservation Twan Leenders diligently leads the charge of these restoration efforts that have massive impacts on regional ecosystems.

Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Early Detection and Rapid Response Efforts Chautauqua Lake, NY

- Conducted public shoreline surveys around the lake to ensure new aquatic invasives were not becoming established
- Continued to monitor and manage known problem areas
- Manually removed invasive water chestnut plants from the lake outlet using low-impact methods
- Coordinated collaborative efforts to slow the spread of Starry Stonewort (SSW)
- Expanded experimental mobitrac treatments to include Diver Assisted Suction Harvesting (DASH)
- Worked closely with partners to maximize removal while carefully monitoring the effectiveness of each method
- Launched a pilot approach to AIS management by reintroducing native aquatic vegetation in areas where invasives were removed
- Identified suitable native species and tested sustainable methods for harvesting and replanting them
- Identified and treated a new SSW hotspot

Waterway Projects

- **37 miles between Cassadaga and Conewango Creeks, NY** - Improved public access and safety. Removed at least **145 navigational hazards** in partnership with the County Department of Public Facilities, arborist Vince Liuzzo, and his highly skilled crew.
- **Conewango Creek, PA** - Risk assessments were conducted along sections of the creek at the invitation of the Conewango Creek Watershed Association. We continue to seek funding in 2026 for work to continue downstream and benefit the entire watershed.
- **Chadakoin River, Jamestown, NY** - Continued to wrap up a major bank restoration project. Stabilized collapsing banks. Restored pollinator habitat with thriving native flowers, grasses, and shrubs.

Stormwater Catchment and Shoreline Projects

- **Southern Tier Brewing Preserve, Ashville, NY** - Will reduce sediment and nutrient loads entering Chautauqua Lake. Restored valuable wildlife habitat. Offers an exciting new public trail system.
- **Grandview Estates, Lakewood, NY** - Will prevent flooding along Fairmount Avenue near the railroad overpass.
- **Wright Park, Dunkirk, NY** - Helps clean stormwater runoff before it enters Lake Erie. Features an educational nature trail for public enjoyment.
- **Main Street Beach, Dunkirk, NY** - Restored native vegetation to support wildlife such as rare tiger beetles. Hosted the first documented Northern Map Turtle nest in Chautauqua County.


